## BRUCE LEE MEMORIAL

Although July 20 is a day of mourning for millions of Bruce Lee fans, there is reason to rejoice this year. From July 15 to July 24, the world's largest, private collection of Bruce Lee memorabilia opens to the public in Los Angeles.

Norman Borine, original founderowner of Dragon International Fan Club, owns the immense collection and organized the memorial.

Fans can view hundreds of original 8-x-10 glossies, both black-and-white and color, plus dozens of color enlargements. Many posters, including unusual lobby posters from Hong Kong, Tokyo and London, are on display.

The list of other Bruce Lee memorabilia is vast—rare, foreign magazines, calendars, slides, postcards, t-shirts and key chains. The exhibit includes wristbands, buttons, wall plaques, notebooks, rings, decals and neck chains.

Bruce Lee enthusiasts may also see one of the original flag banners that was used when *Enter the Dragon* opened at Hollywood's famed Chinese Theater.

The memorial features Lee's original, philosophical books which were published in limited editions.


Collectors will be happy to know that Borine will make some duplicates of his items available.

Color slides will be shown throughout each day. Lee and director Robert Clouse will be seen in a color featurette filmed in Hong Kong during the making of the movie *Enter the Dragon*. The featurette includes some of the movie's fight scenes.

Tickets will not be sold in advance. A donation, accepted at the door, will be applied toward the memorial's expenses.

If public interest warrants, the collection may be moved to a permanent location, thereby becoming the world's first Bruce Lee Memorial Museum, according to Borine.
