

A Letter from Bruce Lee

January 6, 1969

Dear [unclear]

I was looking over my old mail and found most of the letters you wrote me. The latest one or the latest one that I found has this address so I write this letter in hope that even if you have moved, somehow or another, this will reach you.

It has been nearly ten years now since I've been in the States and when I sit down some evening — lost in my recollection of my memories, you are among one of those that often pop up. I sincerely hope you and your family are enjoying the best of everything.

During the last ten years Chinese Martial art has always been a major part of my activity, though I am now in a new field: the field of acting. My achievement in the martial art is most satisfying and the word "Chinese" has come a long way in the circle of martial art due to the fact that all these A.S. Karate free-style champs are studying under me. William I've lost faith in the Chinese Technical art — though I still care mine Chinese — because basically all styles are product of hand economy, even the A.S. school. So my line of training is more toward efficient street fighting with everything goes, wearing head gear, gloves, chest guard, thin knee guards, etc. For the past five years now I've been training the hardest and for a purpose, not just dissipitated hit-and-run training. I'm running every day, sometimes up to six miles. I've named my style just Kung Fu — reason for my not sticking to it because I sincerely feel that this style has more to offer regarding efficiency. I mentioned all the above because it is a major event in my life and like to fill you in with it.

I've been doing good too in the field of acting. I don't know whether or not you've seen my TV series, the "Green Hornet" in Australia, etc.

I've just bought a half acre home on
Bel-Air on top of a hill — plenty of fresh
air — like living out in the country, but tough
on the city running around the hill side.

Well my friend, all in all, that's what
we happened to me — I don't know whether
the will reach you I hope it will
